

Job title: Research Fellow, Economics and Social Policy Unit

Salary and conditions: circa £30,000 plus, depending on experience. This is a full-time role based in Westminster, London.

As a Research Fellow you will have the opportunity to work across all our areas of research. The economics and social policy unit carries out research programmes that range from monetary and fiscal policy to labour markets, competition and trade. Day-to-day, this means that you will be involved in conducting research, generating research ideas, organising events, and talking to policymakers, experts and opinion formers from government, academia, NGOs, parliament, business and media. You will also help with raising the profile of our work, for example through writing blogs and articles. A more experienced Research Fellow would have greater opportunities to lead work independently and get involved in fundraising.

The role offers a chance to be at the forefront of public debate in one of the most compelling, controversial and high-profile policy areas, during a period of significant change.

To be a strong candidate, you should demonstrate the following:

- An intellectual interest in economics and a clear purchase on its analytical tools
- A good degree in a relevant subject. A postgraduate qualification in a related area is desirable, but not essential.
- Relevant professional experience in policy-making and policy-related research.
- An interest in contemporary politics and public policy.
- Good communication skills and ability to write clearly.
- Broadly supportive of market-based and localist solutions to public policy questions.
- Ability to develop a network of contacts.
